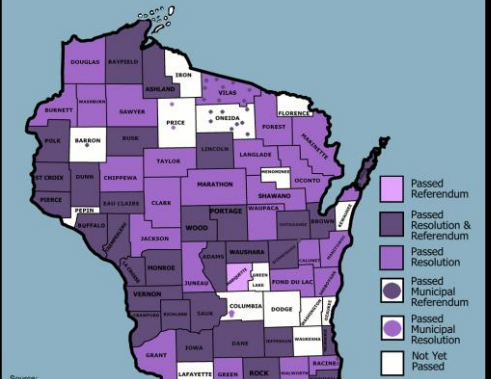

Who Created the Current Maps: Act 94 Maps?

The quick summary:

- WI Supreme Court 2022 maps - **unconstitutional**
- Governor submitted new district maps in their response to WI Supreme Court
- Legislature approved governor's maps (SB 488) - signed into law Feb 2024 under Wisconsin Act 94

What's Good About the New Districts?

- Meet constitutional criteria to be contiguous, compact, and population balanced
- More competitive, less political bias
- Not restricted by 'least- change' approach adopted by legislature and courts in 2022

Maps are in effect now and for Fall 2024 Elections

Important Election Dates

- June 3 – Last date to file candidate nomination papers
- June 27 – Absentee Ballots sent for August Primary
- July 24 – Last day to register online for Primary Election
- July 30 – Early Voting starts for Primary
- **Aug 13 – Fall Primary Election**
- Sept 19 – Absentee Ballots sent for Nov General Election
- Oct 16 – Last day to register online for General Election
- Oct 22 – Early Voting starts for General Election
- **Nov 5 – Fall General Election**



Fall 2024 Elections

- All Assembly seats up for election - as usual
- All Even Senate seats up for election – as usual
- Odd Senate district senators remain as is

How will New Maps Affect Fall Elections?

- 44 Assembly and Senators will run in new districts (38% got moved)
- 66 members of Assembly and Senate won't run again in their old district (41 R; 20 D) (57%)

How will New Maps Affect Fall Elections?

Voters have choices!

- Competitive races in 12 /16 Senate and 84 / 99 Assembly seats (83%, includes primaries)
- Republicans running in 11 Senate districts, 84 Assembly districts
- Democrats running in 16 Senate districts, 97 Assembly districts

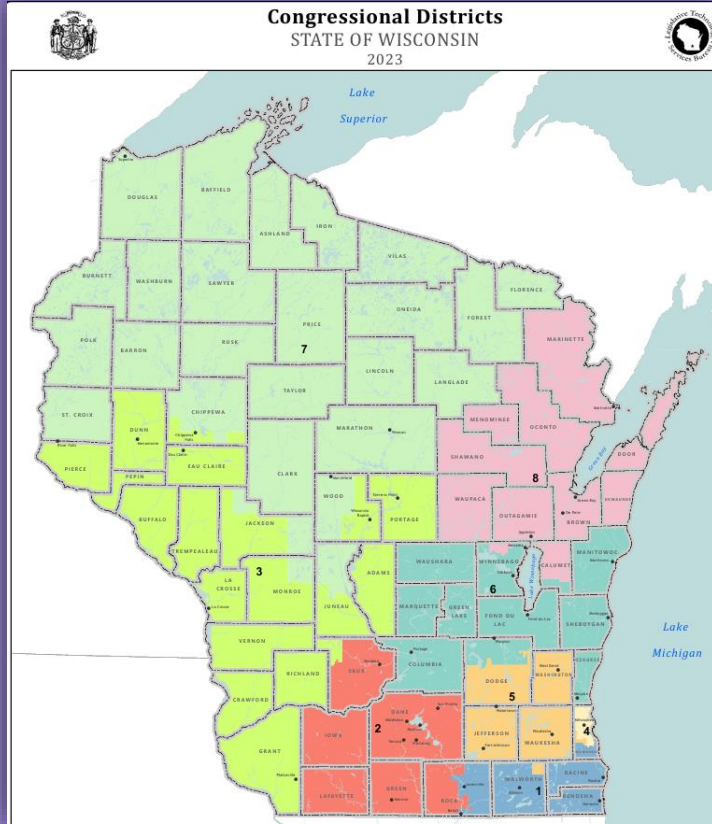
Primary Election – August 13

- At least 26 primaries in the Assembly and Senate this August
- Constitutional amendments on ballot

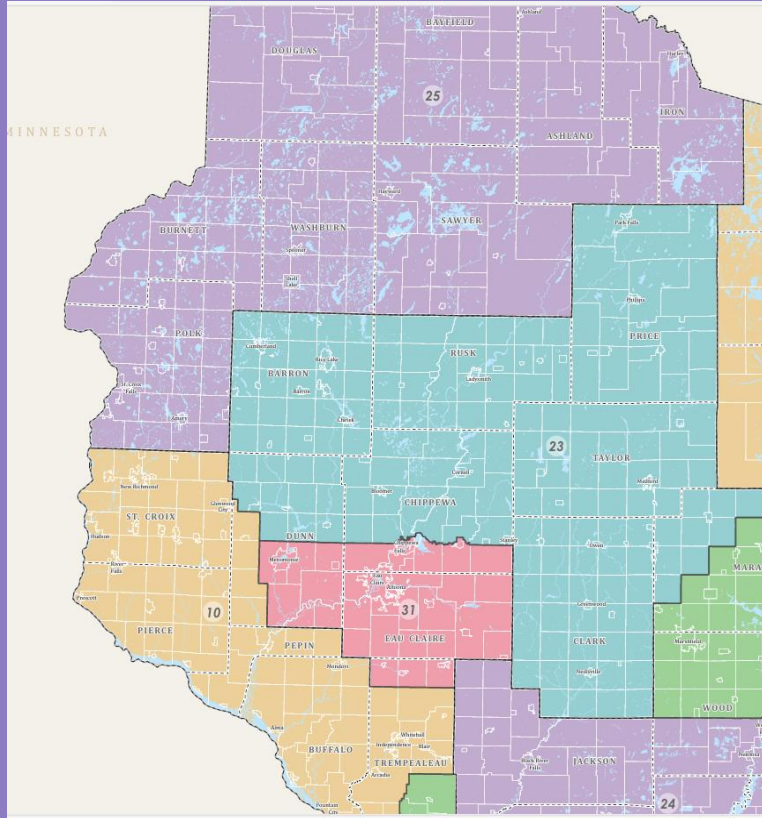

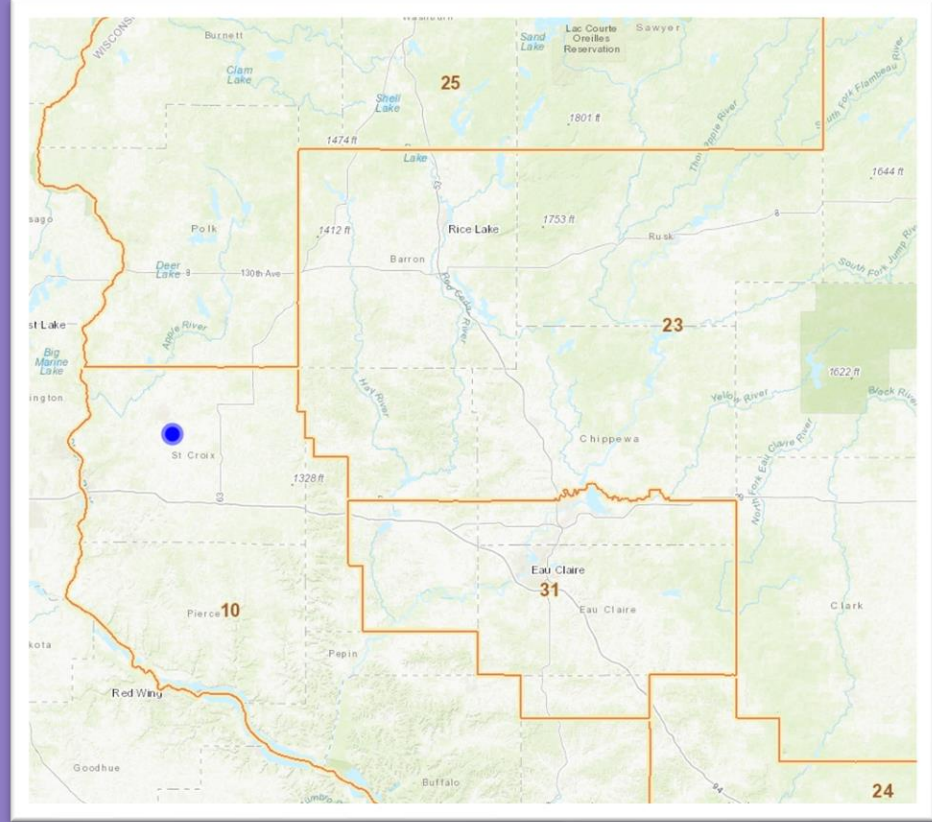
Assembly Districts with Counties



Senate District 10

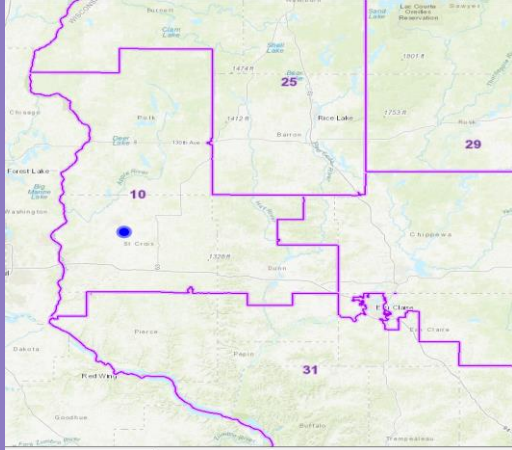


Old - 2022



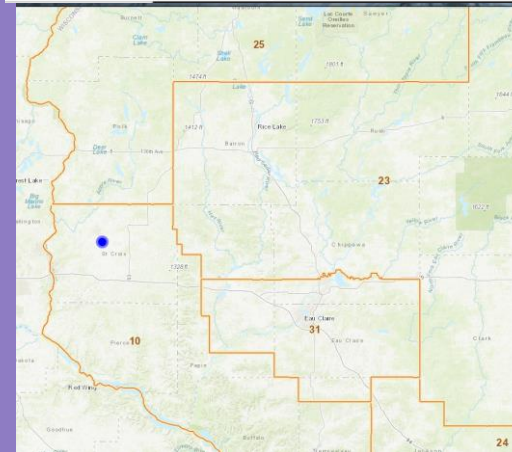

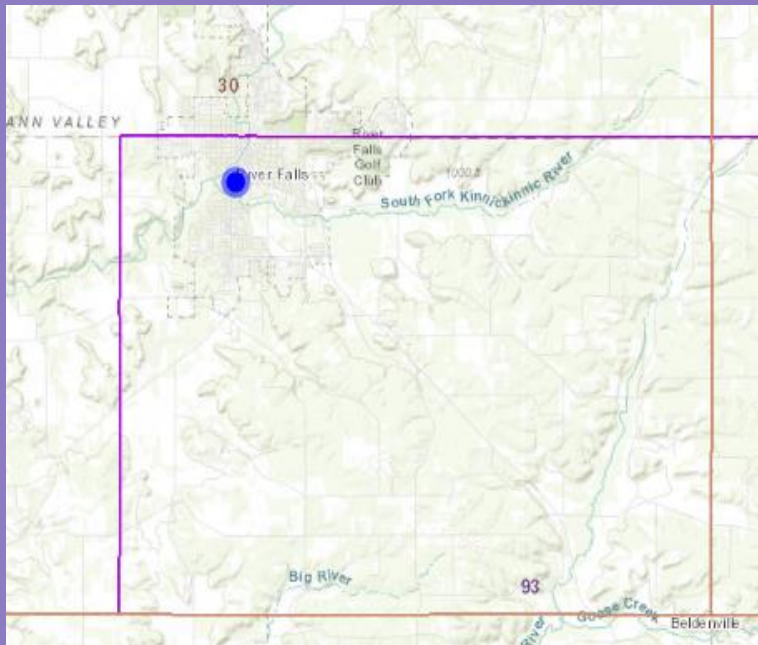


