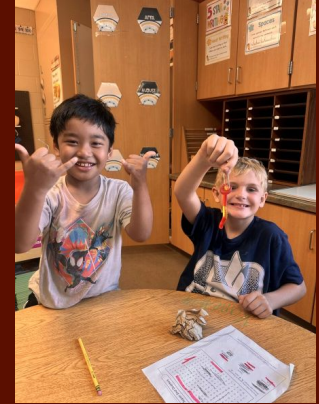
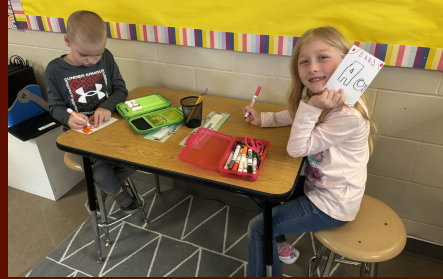
Oaklawn Elementary School
