

# Open Enrollment Regular Education Space Available for the 2021-2022 School Year

## **Elementary General Education**

For Open Enrollment Purposes there is no class size limit

\*The District does not guarantee preference into the elementary school of parent/guardian choice. Placement of open enrolled students into a specific elementary school is a District decision. These decisions are based on the Board Policy 343.1 Class Size and Combined and Split Grades.

# Middle and High School General Education

For Open Enrollment purposes there is no class size limit.

# Open Enrollment Space Availability for Special Education for the 2021-2022 School Year

Projections are best guess estimates. Enrollment in and out of the district as well as new eligibility in and out of special education can change on a daily basis.

# Early Childhood Special Education

\*DPI recommends a maximum number of 5 special education early childhood students with one full-time teacher in a self-contained classroom. For open enrollment purposes, the district will not exceed the recommendation of 5 students with special needs in one section.

## Early Childhood Special Education Class

- The district has 2 sections of early childhood with a licensed special education teacher and paraeducator.
- The district has 2 inclusion sections of early childhood and 4K with 2 licensed teachers and paraeducator.
- Projections for next year is 23 total in the 4 sections (**No space available**)

# **Elementary Special Education**

\*Maximum DPI recommendation for 1.0 FTE teacher working with children with severe disabilities in a self-contained setting is 7-8 students. For open enrollment purposes, the district will not exceed the recommendation of 7-8 students with special needs.

#### Elementary Cognitive Disability Borderline/Severe

• There is one classroom teachers that support students with moderate/severe disabilities with a project count of 9 students (**no space available**)

#### Elementary Autism Program

• There is one classroom that supports students who are identified with severe Autism with a projected count of 10 students (no space available)

#### Elementary Emotional Behavioral Disability (EBD) Program

• There are two classroom teachers that support students identified with EBD with a projected count being 22 students. (no space available)

\*For the purpose of determining available space for cross-categorical special education teachers' grade k-12 the district is using DPI caseload factoring. The Statewide Recommended Caseload Factor Maximum is 24 – which the district will use as a maximum caseload factoring number for Open Enrollment purposes.

# Elementary Cross Categorical Teachers (K-5)

- There are 10 teachers who serve students within a cross categorical setting with a projected combined caseload factoring number of: 238.1
- Maximum caseload with 10 teacher is: 240 (**space is available**)

# Middle School Special Education

\*Maximum DPI recommendation for 1.0 FTE teacher working with children with severe disabilities in a self-contained setting is 7-8 students. For open enrollment purposes, the district will not exceed the recommendation of 7-8 students with special needs.

# Middle School Intellectual Disability Borderline/Severe

• This is one teacher that supports students with moderate/severe disabilities with a projected count of 7 students (**no space available**)

#### Middle School Emotional Behavioral Disability

• There is one classroom teacher that supports students identified with EBD with a projected count being 13 students. (no space available)

\*For the purpose of determining available space for cross-categorical special education teachers' grade k-12 the district is using DPI caseload factoring. The Statewide Recommended Caseload Factor Maximum is 26 – which the district will use as a maximum caseload factoring number for Open Enrollment purposes.

## Middle Cross Categorical Teachers

There are five teachers who serve students within a cross categorical setting with a combined caseload factoring number of: 129.7

Maximum caseload with 4 teacher is: 120 (no space available)

# High School Special Education

\*Maximum DPI recommendation for 1.0 FTE teacher working with children with severe disabilities in a self-contained setting is 7-8 students. For open enrollment purposes, the district will not exceed the recommendation of 7-8 students with special needs.

High School Intellectual Disability Borderline/Severe

• There are two classroom teachers that support students with moderate/severe disabilities with a projected count of 22 students (**no space available**)

## High School Emotional Behavioral Disability

• There are two classroom teachers that support students identified with EBD with a projected count being 36 students. (no space available)

\*For the purpose of determining available space for cross-categorical special education teachers' grade k-12 the district is using DPI caseload factoring. The Statewide Recommended Caseload Factor Maximum is 26 – which the district will use as a maximum caseload factoring number for Open Enrollment purposes.

# High School Cross Categorical Teachers

- There are 6 teachers who serve students within a cross categorical setting with a combined caseload factoring number of: 149.8
- Maximum caseload with 6 teacher is: 144 (no space is available)

## District-Wide Related Service Providers

\*For the purpose of determining speech and language pathologist available space for grades prek-12 the district is using DPI's caseload number chart. The Statewide Recommended Caseload Number Maximum is 35 – which the district will use as a maximum caseload factoring number for Open Enrollment purposes.

# Speech and Language Pathologists (PreK-12)

- There are 4.5 Speech and Language Pathologists that support children throughout the district.
- There are a total of 147 students projected to receive services (space available)

\*For the purpose of determining occupational therapist available space for grades prek-12 the district is using DPI's caseload number chart. The Statewide Recommended Caseload Number Maximum is 30 – which the district will use as a maximum caseload factoring number for Open Enrollment purposes.

#### Occupational Therapist (PreK-12)

- There are 1.5 Occupational Therapists that support children throughout the district.
- There are a total of 73 students projected to receive OT services (no space available)

\*For the purpose of determining physical therapist available space for grades prek-12 the district is using DPI's caseload number chart. The Statewide Recommended Caseload Number Maximum is 30 – which the district will use as a maximum caseload factoring number for Open Enrollment purposes.

## Physical Therapist (PreK-12)

- There is 1 Physical Therapist that supports children throughout the district.
- There is a total of 34 student projected to receive PT services (no space available)
