

Guidance on the Use of Face Coverings

State Mask Order Summary

- The SDMA will be following the WI Governor's <u>Emergency Order #1</u> mandating the use of face coverings (Masks) within the SDMA.
- "Face covering" means a piece of cloth or other material that is worn to cover the nose and mouth completely. A "face covering" includes but is not limited to a bandana, a cloth face mask, a disposable or paper mask, a neck gaiter, or a religious face covering. A "face covering" does not include face shields, mesh masks, masks with holes or openings, or masks with vents.

Expectations for Wearing Face Coverings (Masks) use Within the SDMA

- Face coverings are to be used at all grade levels (4K-Grade 12) by all students, staff, and visitors when indoors (excluding while eating lunch or snack).
- Face coverings are strongly recommended in all other school settings (eg. early childhood), including outdoors when it is not possible to maintain physical distancing.
- Face coverings are required at all grade levels (4K-Grade 12) on buses.
- Visitors to any SDMA facilities are required to wear a face covering unless reasonable accommodations have been prearranged.
- Anyone refusing to wear face coverings as expected will be subject to school disciplinary action.

Providing Face Coverings for School Use

- Families are encouraged to have a cloth face covering for each child for each day of the week.
- All students and staff will be provided a reusable cloth face covering on the first day of school.
- Disposable face coverings will be available at all school buildings and on all school buses.
- Some schools/departments may provide daily laundry services for reusable cloth face coverings.

How to Wear Face Coverings (Masks)

- Wash your hands before putting on your face coverings.
- Use ear bands/ties to put on and remove your face coverings.
- Put it over your nose and mouth and secure it under your chin.
- Try to fit it snugly against the sides of your face.
- Make sure you can breathe easily.
- Both the mouth and nose are to remain covered while face coverings are worn.
- The CDC does not recommend use of masks or cloth masks for source control if they have an exhalation valve or vent.
- It is recommended that face coverings be washed between each daily use.

Exceptions from the Required Use of Face Coverings (Masks) in the SDMA

 Reasonable accommodations will be provided for students, staff and visitors with approved medically documented reasons for not wearing a face covering. Accommodations must be pra-arranged prior to entering any SDMA facility.
